Color Prints

“Move Over Bud or Fly”,
by Bob Rush

The picture was taken by me on 6-26-04, 1:50pm in Hanover County, VA at the home of my sister-in-law. On the back deck of her home she has 5 hummingbird feeders and there seems to be 25 or 30 hummingbirds coming in and out of there at most times of the day.

On this particular day I had made many shots of the birds but then I noticed a butterfly feeding on one of the feeders. I set my Sony f717 at f4,

1/500 and ISO 100, focused, then just as I clicked the shutter, a hummingbird flew into the picture giving me this bonus which I named "MOVE OVER BUD____OR FLY."

Black & White

“Harley” by Bert Jemmott

The picture is a panning shot of a Harley and rider. The panning motion keeps the motorcycle and rider in focus and blurs the background giving a feeling of motion. The picture was taken with a Canon digital rebel SLR (6.3MP) with a canon 28 -135 mm image stabilized lens. Processing in PhotoShop CS included slight cropping, exposure correction, and conversion to black and white.

Digitally Manipulated

“Grizzly” by Bert Jemmott

The picture was of a grizzly taken in the Grand Teton National Park. The picture was taken with a Canon digital rebel SLR (6.3MP) with a Sigma 170-500mm lens for an effective focal length of 800mm. The picture was manipulated in PhotoShop CS to include using the clone stamp to remove two dead trees. The Grizzly’s head was then selected with the magnetic lasso and sharpened. A radial blur filter in the zoom mode was then applied to everything but the head to give the impression that the bear is charging the camera.

Austin zoo waterfall - was shot at probably 1/60 at F22, not sure. A 300mm lens and Velvia 100 film was used on a overcast day.

Upcoming Speakers

Our November speaker will be Tom Siegmond from TCC Visual Arts Center. The subject is Digital Photography. Below is Tom's Bio.

I received my BFA in 1985, and my MFA in 1992 from Old Dominion University in Norfolk Virginia. Since then I have been teaching for the past 14 years. I have taught at ODU, Norfolk State, and The Governors School for the Arts. For the Past 10 years I have been fortunate to teach at the Visual Arts Center where I hold the position of Assistant Professor and Program Head of the Photography Department. I have exhibited my work regionally since the early 90's.

Formally speaking, I tend to approach the photographic process as a painter or printmaker. I am attracted to the digital process

because of its layering capabilities. Over a blank canvas I can manipulate and combine my own photographs with appropriated images. I can add color texture and text. I can construct fantasy from reality and more thoroughly explore narrative. The layering potential allows me more control, precision, flexibility and options in exploring and constructing these narratives. My black and white digital portraits and still life's have a more traditional appearance.

In terms of subject matter, my work depicts life choices, regrets, timing, origins, journeys, and that sort. The work illustrates the sometimes-humorous way in which memories, dreams, fantasies, and a continuing barrage of daily images merge. It's about the fun experienced in exorcising each combination of images from the mind, making room for the next

group, and trying to decipher what it all means when the smoke clears.

Finally, I tend to see my art as a vehicle for healing, and believe this is its most important function. As I complete each image, I sense a cleansing. I'm taken to a place that is both peaceful and uncomplicated.
